Why a league, and why T20

The format is the argument.

- A weekly hundred-question mock tests you on any one subject about six times in a year, and lets everything in between go cold. You find out you are weak in Environment in November, for a paper in May.
- So we cut the year into **100 matches of 20 questions**, each match a tight family of topics rather than a scatter across the syllabus.
- You play more often. You fail smaller. You fix faster. By the time the Simulators begin, the elimination instinct is built rather than borrowed.

A hundred matches before the one that counts.

SMALL MATCHES, PLAYED OFTEN, ARE HOW A REFLEX IS BUILT

The season

The league opens on 1 September 2026. The last Simulator lands three weeks clear of the exam.

- Matches go live in batches through the season, opening across subjects, so you can start with whatever you are reading right now rather than waiting your turn.
- Everything is in your hands well before the Simulators begin, so the last stretch is yours to plan.

- The tenth Simulator is on **2 May 2027**, three weeks before the exam, leaving you a clean final stretch for revision.

- Economy gets nineteen matches because Economy is about eighteen percent of the real paper. Modern History gets seven because it is seven. We counted the last sixteen years, we did not guess.

The blueprint is UPSC's

WE DID NOT DESIGN THE COVERAGE. WE MEASURED IT.

- **1,600 real questions, 2011 to 2026**, taken apart one at a time.
- **325 micro-topics**, each one a subject, topic and sub-topic combination UPSC has actually set a question on. Not a syllabus heading. A tested thing.
- **How often UPSC asks something decides how much of the season it gets.** That weighting holds all the way down to the individual match, not just to the subject.
- **Related topics are grouped, so one match covers one family.** If a topic is too big for a single match, it carries into the next one.
- Every one of the 325 is printed in this document, match by match.

The shapes: what UPSC dropped, and what it runs now

A series built on the old mix trains you for a paper that stopped existing in 2021.

We took all 1,600 questions from 2011 to 2026 apart, one at a time. Three things changed, and they changed everything.

- **The count question did not exist, and now it dominates.** "How many of the above are correct" appears **zero times in every paper from 2011 to 2021**. It arrived in 2022, and by 2023 it took **47 of the 100 questions**. Knowing three items out of four earns nothing on these.
- **Statement-I and Statement-II arrived with it.** One appearance in the eleven years up to 2021, then **18 in 2023, 13 in 2024 and 14 in 2025**.
- **The textbook "Assertion (A) and Reason (R)" is not in the paper at all.** Zero appearances across all sixteen years. What 2026 actually ran was "*Consider the following assertion*" followed by numbered statements, where you identify which ones support it. That is the version you will meet here.

The shapes you will be set

Sixteen distinct shapes run across the season.

- Direct single-fact, which-statements-are-correct with a code, Statement-I and Statement-II, how many of the above are correct, which pairs are correctly matched, assertion with supporting statements, term in context, odd one out, best explanation, and more besides.
- **Three of them are ours.** Best inference, two-condition statement and data nugget are shapes UPSC has not run yet, each drilling a skill the paper has been visibly moving toward.

Current affairs, in every single match

- **Two slots in every paper**, and they sit **inside that paper's own subject**, because that is how the real paper asks current affairs. Never as a bolted-on block at the end.
- The Economy matches carry the Economy news, the Environment matches carry the Environment news, and current affairs stops being a separate subject you keep meaning to start.

You play it like the real paper

- A live clock, a question palette showing answered, unanswered, marked and not-visited, mark-for-review, and keyboard shortcuts so your hands learn the paper and not the mouse.
- A submit screen that stops you and counts what you left blank, because the commonest unforced error in Prelims is walking away from a question you meant to come back to.
- **And an elimination tool built into the paper.** Strike out an option the moment you rule it out, up to three per question, and restore it if you change your mind. It is the Sherlock method, on screen, while the clock runs.

The match is half of it. The read-back is the other half.

Seven analyses land the moment you submit. Not a score and a rank. Seven.

ELIMINATION, ACTUALLY MEASURED

- How many questions you used elimination on, your **elimination accuracy**, and the number that matters most: **your accuracy with elimination against your accuracy without it**, in percentage points.
- What happened when you narrowed to one option, to two, to three, and how often each was right.
- **And how many times you struck out the correct answer.** That one line is worth the whole report.
- Every series tells you to eliminate. **This is the one that scores whether your elimination is working.**

CONFIDENCE, DECLARED BEFORE YOU ARE TOLD THE ANSWER

- Tag each answer as certain, confident but unsure, an educated guess, or a random guess. It costs a second.
- Afterwards you get accuracy, marks and time for each of the four bands.
- The band that decides Prelims is **certain and wrong**: the facts you believe and should not. A score alone can never surface them, because you were sure. This does.

WHERE YOUR MARKS LEAK ON THE CLOCK

- Accuracy and average time per question, quarter by quarter through the paper.
- Slow starter? Falling away in the last quarter? Spending eighty seconds on the ones you get wrong and fifty on the ones you get right? Those are habits, and habits are fixable once you can see them.

STANDING, PEERS AND PATTERNS

- **Rank and percentile** against everyone who has played that match, plus peer comparison and a pattern read that builds across the season.

A hundred read-backs, not four.

YOU FIND THE LEAK IN SEPTEMBER, NOT IN MAY

The Simulators: ten finals, ten real papers

EVERY SUNDAY, 28 FEBRUARY TO 2 MAY 2027

- **Ten full-length FLT's, 100 questions, real clock**, run exactly like the morning itself.
- **Each Simulator mirrors one real UPSC paper's DNA:** its subject spread, its shape mix, its difficulty. Some come out Economy-heavy, some Polity-heavy, some brutal, exactly as the real years did.
- Averaging the last ten papers gives you a paper UPSC has never set. **So we do not average.** The variance is the point, because on the day you get one paper, not the mean of ten.
- **Full subject-wise analysis after each**, so the last stretch of revision goes exactly where the marks are leaking.

MORE THAN PRACTICE

Set on where the paper is heading, not only where it has been

The Simulators are built on the themes most likely to be asked. You walk in with two edges: the trained eye to handle anything adjacent, and a fair share of direct hits, questions you have already reasoned through before UPSC sets them.

Who runs it

Neil sir, HCS 2021, Rank 93.

- The elimination method taught here is the one he cleared with, written down and turned into a full season of questions. Sherlocking is not a slogan on this series: it is a skill the paper is built to drill and the platform is built to measure.

Why this is the season to be in

The clock on Prelims 2027 has already started. UPSC notifies on 13 January 2027 and sets the paper on 23 May. Everything between now and then is preparation you either did or did not do.

- **You get the whole year, from the first match.** The biggest block goes first: nineteen Economy matches, the heaviest subject in the real paper. Join at the start and you ride it.
- **Every question is fresh.** Each one is checked against every other paper in the league and against sixteen years of real previous-year papers before it ships.
- **Nothing about it is hidden.** All 325 micro-topics are printed in this document, match by match. You can count what you are buying.
- **You are measured on the skill, not just the score.** Seven analyses after every match, including one that tells you whether your elimination is earning marks or costing them.
- **And you finish with room.** The last Simulator is three weeks before the exam.

The full syllabus, match by match

All 100 matches and all 325 micro-topics, so you can see exactly what the season covers.

- Every match is 18 questions across its listed micro-topics, plus 2 current-affairs questions inside the same subject.
- Related topics are grouped, so one match covers one family. A topic too big for a single match carries into the next, which is why a few names appear twice in a row.
- Match numbers are the sequence of the season, not dates.
